Message from the Chairman

My wife, Kelly, and I met some old friends from the early 1990s from our time at Fort Polk in the city of Natchitoches recently at a bed and breakfast. We ate dinner together, visited, walked up and down Front Street to see the shops, etc. We met the owner that evening when he stopped by to check on things while we were playing cards in the parlor. (I've been wanting to use that word "parlor" for a while.) It turns out the owner of the B&B is also the owner of the restaurant where we dined. Both were great experiences by the way. It also turns out the owner who we will call "John" is a graduate of the higher education institution where I work with a degree in one of the majors for which I teach a lot of courses. He seems like a great guy to me. We discussed names of several people we both knew. He shared lots of stories about his experiences. Small world, right? You know what I mean, don't you? Now you're wondering why I shared all that, aren't you?

One story John shared was of a quote he heard from a leader that he said he would never forget. While waiting his turn for a meeting with the boss, it seems he couldn't help but overhear a loud counseling session where a leader was expressing his dissatisfaction with a subordinate's work results. What bothered him most was that he knew he was next up for counseling with the boss and he had some bad news about an internal audit. What he overheard went something like this:. "You are not paid to do the best you can do, you are paid to get the job done." That's not the full quote. In John's memory it also included some additional colorful adjectives or adverbs which I have chosen to omit from this article, but you get the idea. As I processed the story and the quote that evening and later, I thought of several times from over the years either in the military or in the engineering profession when I have heard something similar. It gets your attention. Maybe it makes you work harder than you otherwise would. Maybe it is a good quote for leaders. I have my concerns though. I will share them later.

Shift gears. I hope you read the story I discovered in the article called "The Unnatural But Ethical Act of Admitting Mistakes" by Rebecca Bowman, P.E., Esq. She is the National Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE) senior director for ethics and professional practice. In the Spring 2021 PE Magazine, Rebecca shares that "Various philosophers and grandmothers have reminded us that the only way to avoid mistakes is to do nothing. Since we are not doing nothing, we will make mistakes. Consequently, we have to examine the mistakes we make as learning opportunities - opportunities to learn where we went awry - as well as accept personal responsibility." I like what Rebecca has to say to us all about ethics and professional behavior.

Later she shares a personal story about a recent visit from her grandson when he broke something. "He came to me quickly and fessed up. We sat down and talked about how his speedy acknowledgement of his mistake did not eliminate the consequences, but that his speedy acknowledgement did

prevent the problem from getting bigger. He is only three, but the same principle holds for us. The sooner we recognize and identify a problem or mistake, the sooner it can be addressed. However, more importantly, the sooner we recognize and identify a problem or mistake, the more limited the scope of the implications. Problems almost never go away, or even shrink, if we ignore them. Problems tend to take root and grow if we try to bury them. Problems cannot be appropriately addressed if the responsible source has attempted to conceal, to delay discovery, or to transfer attention to someone else."

What can we learn from Rebecca's experiences with her three year old grandson? Let's go back to the scenario with the boss who does not accept failure. Success whatever the costs? Trust me, I agree with the whole Warrior Ethos, Never Quit, attitude. I'm an Airborne Ranger after all. The trouble is that we have a difficult time controlling when our subordinates may cover up trouble, take inappropriate dangerous shortcuts, or even commit criminal acts. Be careful what you tell yourself that you and your employees would never do. A pastor friend of mine once shared something like this, "With the right opportunity and the right provocation, don't be surprised at the offenses of which each of us is capable." So what is it then? Are we paid to do the best we can? Or are we paid to get the job done no matter the cost? Even with good intentions, I submit to you that this seemingly good leadership quote has the potential to lead to regrettable decisions and perhaps even disastrous consequences for the public.

I remember many phrases from my time in the US Army. One was "Mission First, People Always". Of course, you're paid to get the job done. No doubt. That being said, you do the best you can to get the job done while focusing on our higher common purpose as licensed professional land surveyors and engineers. We have a responsibility to "safeguard life, health, and property and to promote the public welfare".

LOLA: A Leap Forward for Licensure

It is my honor, as IT Director of LAPELS, to present the latest generation software system for Professional, Intern, and Firm licensure in the state of Louisiana: LOLA-S (LAPELS Online Automated System), or LOLA for short. Built from scratch, entirely structured on LAPELS staff input, and nearly 2 years in the making from conception to execution, LOLA represents a huge leap forward in translating LAPELS-specific office operations into a new system with a new interface. This new system prioritizes ease of user experience and intuitive design logic, as well as "future-proof" design, i.e., it will easily be able to accommodate future changes in both technology and the Louisiana Laws and Rules protocols of licensure.

Inflexible, approaching obsolescence, and inefficient are all descriptions of a software system no one wants to use, own, or be responsible for maintaining. Yet, these are all terms which described the LAPELS legacy system. The software, acquired nearly 20 years ago, was a huge step forward at the time, as it supported the current technologies of the era. Unfortunately, as LAPELS moved forward and evolved, this business software was unable to grow with their needs. LAPELS' solution to this problem was LOLA. LOLA is a new business system built from the ground up solely and specifically for LAPELS by Tri-Core Technologies, and is rooted in the guiding principles of engineering and innovation.

LOLA is a product of an enormous effort by both the LAPELS staff and Tri-Core development team. Tri-Core is a local Baton Rouge software development company; thus, the LAPELS staff and Tri-Core team were able to easily and directly work together over many months to develop LOLA to fully support the needs of LAPELS. LAPELS staff were instrumental from the very start of the project. The development effort began with intensive day-long working sessions to define the needs and process of LAPELS, and proceeded with a focus on refining the requirements and striving to improve and add value to all LAPELS processes.

During the development of LOLA, the processes were tested both internally and externally, and improved continuously. Additional functionality was also added to LOLA which did not exist in the legacy system, including: (1) integration with the LAPELS enterprise document management system (Laserfiche); (2) integration of the application, renewal, and reinstatement processes with Microsoft Exchange to fast-track all areas of individual and firm licensure; as well as to provide pertinent automated email notifications to applicants and licensees on a consistent basis; (3) a secure online messaging system, also integrated with Microsoft Exchange, that enables close-to-real-time messaging between LAPELS staff and applicants/licensees.

Another notable design improvement is the close mirroring of both internal processes used by the staff and the external processes used by applicants and licensees. This close alignment of the processes enables the LAPELS staff to more easily assist outside users, reduces the amount and complexity of system code to maintain; and creates a system which is faster in both responsiveness and user interaction.

However, LOLA's greatest long term value lies in the fact that LAPELS owns the LOLA source code, meaning that LAPELS can make any changes to LOLA that it requires and the system can itself evolve as technology evolves.

LOLA was recently deployed and immediately began adding value to LAPELS. By noon of the first day, external users were creating accounts, applications were being submitted, and payments were being received. The process improvements of LOLA also became instantly apparent: processes which previously took several days or more were being completed within the same day, on day one. By all measures LOLA is a success. It is continuing to improve as a result of staff and user feedback, and will continue to grow as other LAPELS operations are incorporated into it.

As the second oldest licensing board of its kind in the United States, founded in 1908 and now in its 113th year of operation, LAPELS now has a system that will fully complement its needs, the needs of applicants and licensees, and the needs of evolving Laws and Rules for licensure in the state of Louisiana.

Martin Pitts, PE, LLC, an unlicensed firm which subsequently became licensed as a professional engineering firm effective October 2, 2019 (EF-7038), was subject to enforcement action by the Board for practicing and/or offering to practice without proper licensure in violation of La. R.S. 37:681 and La. R.S. 37:700(A)(1) and (9), to wit LAC Title 46:LXI§2301(B). Between April 2018 and March 30, 2021 the firm admittedly offered to provide engineering services in Louisiana and provided engineering services on 10 projects in Louisiana. 

Engineering Education, LES

We have seven higher education institutions in Louisiana that provide an EAC/ABET engineering bachelor's degree. They are Louisiana Tech University in Ruston; Southern University and Louisiana State University, both in Baton Rouge; the University of New Orleans and Tulane University, both in New Orleans; the University of Louisiana at Lafayette; and McNeese State University in Lake Charles. I reached out to the deans of the colleges of engineering and some peers at each of these institutions. Those that responded addressed how this past year in engineering education has included a heavy dose of overcoming adversity. Here's a response from Mitchell Morgan, Department Head of Engineering and Computer Science at McNeese. It turns out Lake Charles was hit much harder than I was aware. "At McNeese State University, our students know all about overcoming obstacles. Just in the last fifteen months, we had a global pandemic, two devastating hurricanes, massive freeze, and a major flood that affected our campus and students' lives. We are Cowboy Strong and made it through these difficulties bigger and better because of it! As we sit with

the 2020-2021 school year behind us, we wonder what the next school year will bring. Will it be more of the same or will it be better? Many of the buildings have been repaired and are now open but some are a total loss and will eventually be torn down and rebuilt. The trees have green leaves on them again and the grass is no longer covered with debris. The campus is starting to look normal again. This school year was tough on all the faculty and students. Five major disasters could not hold us down. We got up, brushed ourselves off, and got back in the saddle. Our Cowboys and Cowgirls are tough. We work hard and never complain. We get the job done no matter the obstacles."

Terry Chambers, a mechanical engineering faculty member shared, "We do have a lot going on in the UL Lafayette College of Engineering, including a push to provide renewable energy research, education, workforce development and outreach. This is a timely development, since all the major electrical utilities are in the process of building new solar power plants and there is a shortage of trained solar energy system workers in the state. Other renewable technologies will also become increasingly important in the near future, such as offshore wind, carbon capture and sequestration, battery storage, and microgrids, and the state will also need to ramp up its offerings in order to support those growing industries as well. In order to help meet those needs, we recently created a Renewable Energy Minor, designed to provide students with a technical and competitive edge in the growing field of renewable energy. We have also recently launched five industry-oriented professional development courses in the area of solar energy, suitable for working professionals who want to upgrade their skills to get started in the solar industry."

Here's the perspective of Gianna Cothren, Civil & Environmental Engineering, University of New Orleans. "Though the abrupt transition into teaching and learning completely online was difficult to navigate, our faculty members worked hard to still give the best classes they could by adapting and learning new technology instantly. The current pandemic protocol status at UNO is phase D which means for many of us in Engineering we expect to return to our in-person classes in Fall 2021 as long as there are no major upticks in COVID cases in our city and state. Faculty and students are strongly encouraged, but not required, to get vaccinated so that we may return to some degree of normalcy. We are also encouraged to self-report to the university and quarantine if we experience any COVID-19 symptoms. For the Fall 2021, the University is encouraging more and more in-person classes. The Civil Engineering department will have at least 60% of the classes back on campus and the College of Engineering in general will likely have 50% or more in-person classes. Though we are returning to our new normal, we are ready to move back to hybrid or online in an instant, if required. As a result of this whole experience, some of the technology that we quickly adapted will likely become part of our future."

Josh Duplechain, director of communications for the LSU College of Engineering, shared that the plan is "to be completely in-person this fall and back to business pre-lockdown." One of the links Josh shared was a message to students from Associate Dean Craig Harvey. He ended with, "Finishing Strong: None of us prefer the current environment or asked for it, of course. At the same time, we are LSU Engineers, and thus, we know how to handle a challenge. It is part of our DNA. So, I encourage you to stay strong as we all face this challenge. We all want you to be successful, and working together, we can all weather this storm."

Dr. Heath Tims is the associate dean for undergraduate studies for the College of Engineering and Science at Louisiana Tech. I heard some encouraging remarks he made to students participating in a winter banquet. "Each of us here have been helped and trained by others that came before us, and we are responsible for helping to do the same to the underclassmen. You are a part of how education works at a university. Many of us haven't ever thought about why universities are the way they are, but the general idea is that they were essentially set up to be apprenticeship type models. You are learning under "experts" and "leaders" in a field of study. You are expected to use these mentors until the point that you can then go out on your own. The part we don't talk about often though is your role as students. You are a part of this apprenticeship model as well. The incoming students look to you and they emulate you. This includes your academics, your service, and even your personal lives. You are who we want our incoming students to become. I thank you for being a part of educating them, even when you didn't realize it."

Bossier Parish Community College offers an Associate of Science in Engineering that articulates to LA Tech, so I reached out to June Schneider, engineering program director, and she shared, "One of the 14 Engineering Grand challenges is 'Advanced personal learning'. This paradigm shift to cope with the pandemic helped us to accelerate brainstorming, developing and executing new ways to deliver engineering curriculum learning. Moving forward, we will be reverting back to face-to-face instructions in the classrooms. I know that as a faculty returning to the classroom in Fall 2021, I will enjoy it thoroughly and provide students with supplemental instructional materials that we have built during the pandemic."



The Louisiana session adjourned on June 10th, but the action has not stopped as the Governor's vetoes of a handful of bills has the legislature returning on July 20th to host our state's first in modern history "veto override session" where it will require 2/3rds vote to override a vetoed measure.

Two pieces of legislation currently have the best chance of having a veto reversed: SB 156 by Sen. Beth Mizell, which is titled the "Fairness in Women's Sports Act," and SB 118, the "permit-less carry" legislation by Sen. Jay Morris. SB 118 has pushback from law enforcement putting the 2/3rds override votes in question. There were 28 bills vetoed in total and only a handful at this time are expected to receive a vote.

Some bills of interest that passed during the general session related to engineering included Representative Foy Gadberry's HB 491 which allows for ethics exemptions to the bid law as well as HB 323, which altered prohibitive price applicability for engineers and architects.


The legislature also made one of the most significant investments to infrastructure in recent memory. Speaker Pro Tempore Tanner Magee's HB 514 will fund major projects across the state, such as a new Baton Rouge bridge, and will tap future general fund dollars instead of the proposed and failed gas tax. Other infrastructure and water projects were funded in the following bills: HB 1, HB 2, HB 639 and HB 642.

With a continued parade of promotions and resignations in the House and Senate, seats are coming open and will likely be filled with special elections in-time with the October 9th New Orleans Municipal Primary, and November 13th General Election.

As always, we encourage our LES members and local chapters to reach out to their House and Senate members over the rest of 2021. In early 2022 the legislature will meet in a not yet scheduled redistricting special session, followed by the general session March 14, 2022 through June 6, 2022.

LOOKING BACK Memoir of Marshall Pope Robertson*

Charter Member of the Louisiana Engineering Society

Marshall Pope Robertson was born at Baton Rouge, LA, on April 26, 1861. He received his early education in the Parish of East Baton Rouge and was graduated in 1882 from the Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College at Baton Rouge, LA.

During his summer vacations in 1881 and 1882, Mr. Robertson was employed as Rodman and Resident Engineer on construction on the Texas and Pacific Railroad.

From 1883 to 1894, he served as City Surveyor of Baton Rouge, LA. While in this position, he was also engaged on work for the United States Government, as Engineer in charge of the construction of roadways to the Military Cemeteries at Port Hudson, LA, Corinth, MS and Marietta, GA from 1889 to 1891, and as United States Surveyor for the Lower Texas District on levees from Vicksburg, MS to the mouth of the Red River.

In August 1896 he was appointed an Assistant to the Board of State Engineers of Louisiana which position he retained until August 1900 when he was appointed Assistant State Engineer and Member of the Board of State Engineers. From 1900 to 1902 Mr. Robertson had charge, for the State, of levees and canals on the Red River and from 1902 to 1908 he was in direct charge of work on the Mississippi River and on levees on the Arkansas and Mississippi Rivers.

From 1908 to 1912 he was engaged in the private practice of engineering of an extensive and varied character. In 1912 he was again appointed a Member of the Board of State Engineers and served in that capacity continuously until his death in November 1917.

Mr. Robertson was honorable, capable and conscientious in the discharge of his duties to which he brought to bear the faculty of a good judgement acquired by the experience of many years, and, at the time of his death, the Board of State Engineers, of which he was for so long a member, passed resolutions expressing its appreciation of his valuable services and its sorrow at the loss sustained by his family and by the State.


